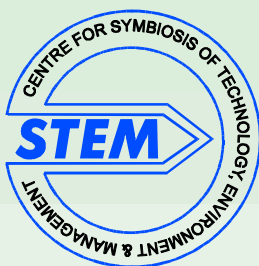

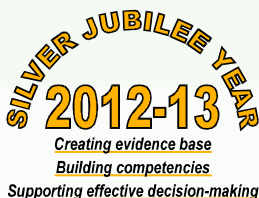

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### WHY THIS PROGRAMME

The 74th constitutional amendment act (CAA) envisaged creation of vibrant urban local bodies which would be empowered with funds, functions and functionaries. JnNURM started in 2005 gives an impetus to urban development in the country by providing financial as well as technical assistance. In order to avail the funds under JnNURM, each city and town are expected to prepare a City Development Plan (CDP), which is a visioning exercise. To take the CDP forward a Detailed Project Report (DPR) need to be also prepared by each city. A large number of cities and towns have completed the initial stage of preparing the CDP and gearing up themselves with preparation DPR and implementation. This requires that the administrators and other key professionals have the required knowledge and skills relevant to project management. This Professional Enrichment Programme of STEM fills this particular gap. JnNURM also offers support for capacity building for preparation of CDP and DPR.

### OBJECTIVE

The programme aspires to enhance the knowledge and skills of Participants with respect to Project Management.
